

OPENING SENTENCE

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.

CONFESSION

Let us humbly confess our sins to almighty God.

Almighty and most merciful Father, We have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep, We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts, We have offended against thy holy laws, We have left undone those things which we ought to have done, And we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us. But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare thou them, O God, which confess their faults. Restore thou them that are penitent; According to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesu our Lord. And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, To the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

PARDON THROUGH THE CROSS

Almighty Father, who of thy great love to men didst give thy dearly beloved Son to die for us; Grant that through his Cross our sins may be put away, and remembered no more against us, and that, cleansed by his Blood, and mindful of his sufferings, we may take up our cross daily, and follow him in newness of life, until we come to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**

PSALM 16 - Conserva me, Domine

- 1 Preserve me, O God: for in thee have I put my trust.

- 4 But they that run after another god: shall have great trouble.
- 5 Their drink-offerings of blood will I not offer : neither make mention of their names within my lips.
- 6 The Lord himself is the portion of mine inheritance and of my cup: thou shalt maintain my lot.
- 7 The lines are fallen unto me in pleasant places : yea, I have a goodly heritage.
- 8 I will thank the Lord for giving me counsel: my heart also instructeth me in the night-season.

THE FIRST LESSON: Zechariah 9.9-12

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on an ass, on a colt the foal of an ass. I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth. As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your captives free from the waterless pit. Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.

O Saviour of the world who by thy Cross and precious Blood hast redeemed us : save us and help us we humbly beseech thee, O Lord.

Thou didst save thy disciples when ready to perish:

hear us and save us we humbly beseech thee.

Let the pitifulness of thy great mercy:

loose us from our sins we humbly beseech thee.

Make it appear that thou art our Saviour and mighty Deliverer:

O save us that we may praise thee we humbly beseech thee.

Draw near according to thy promise from the throne of thy glory:

look down and hear our crying we humbly beseech thee.

Come again and dwell with us, O Lord Christ Jesus:

abide with us for ever we humbly beseech thee.

And when thou shalt appear with power and great glory: may we be made like unto thee, in thy glorious Kingdom.

THE SECOND LESSON: 1 Peter 2.11-end

Beloved, I beseech you as aliens and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh that wage war against your soul. Maintain good conduct among the Gentiles, so that in case they speak against you as wrongdoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation. Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to praise those who do right. For it is God's will that by doing right you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish men. Live as free men, yet without using your freedom as a pretext for evil; but live as servants of God. Honour all men. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the emperor. Servants, be submissive to your masters with all respect, not only to the kind and gentle but also to the overbearing. For one is approved if, mindful of God, he endures pain while suffering unjustly. For what credit is it, if when you do wrong and are beaten for it you take it patiently? But if when you do right and suffer for it you take it patiently, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his

steps. He committed no sin; no guile was found on his lips. When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he trusted to him who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls.

CANTICLE: Benedictus

Blessed be the Lord God of Israel: for he hath visited and redeemed his people; And hath raised up a mighty salvation for us: in the house of his servant David; As he spake by the mouth of his holy Prophets: which have been since the world began; That we should be saved from our enemies: and from the hands of all that hate us: To perform the mercy promised to our forefathers: and to remember his holy covenant; To perform the oath which he sware to our forefather Abraham: that he would grant us That we being delivered out of the hands of our enemies: might serve him without fear, In holiness and righteousness before him: all the days of our life. And thou, child, shalt be called the Prophet of the Highest: for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways; To give knowledge of salvation unto his people: for the remission of their sins: Through the tender mercy of our God: whereby the day-spring from on high hath visited us; To give light to them that sit in darkness, and in the shadow of death: and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

THE EPISTLE. 1 St Peter 3. 17.

It is better, if the will of God be so, that ye suffer for well-doing, than for evil-doing. For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit: by which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison; which sometime were disobedient, when once the long-suffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared; wherein few, that is, eight souls, were saved by water. The like figure whereunto, even baptism, doth also now save us, (not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience towards God,) by the resurrection of Jesus Christ: who is gone into heaven, and is on the right hand of God, angels and authorities and powers being made subject unto him.

THE TRACT: PSALM 42.8-14

My soul is vexed within me; therefore will I remember thee: from the land of Jordan, from Hermon, and the Little Hill. One deep calleth another, because of the noise of thy torrents: all thy waves and thy billows are gone over me. The Lord will grant his loving kindness in the daytime: and in the night season will I sing of him, and make my prayer unto the God of my life. I will say unto God my rock, 'Why hast thou forgotten me?: why go I thus heavily, while the enemy oppresseth me?' My bones are smitten asunder, while mine enemies reproach me: while they say daily unto me, 'Where is now thy God?' Why art thou so vexed, O my soul?: and why art thou so disquieted within me? O put thy trust in God, for I will yet give him thanks: who is the help of my countenance, and my God.

THE GOSPEL: St Matthew 27. 57.

When the even was come, there came a rich man of Arimathaea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple. He went to Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be delivered. And when Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock; and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed. And there was Mary Magdalene, and the other Mary, sitting over against the sepulchre. Now the next day, that followed the day of the preparation, the chief priests and Pharisees came together unto Pilate, saying, Sir, we remember that that deceiver said, while he was yet alive, After three days I will rise again. Command therefore that the sepulchre be made sure until the third day, lest his disciples come by night and steal him away, and say unto the people, He is risen from the dead: so the last error shall be worse than the first. Pilate said unto them, Ye have a watch; go your way, make it as sure as you can. So they went and made the sepulchre sure, sealing the stone, and setting a watch.

TABLE PRAYERS
